The physical embodiment of a dream then became reality for the animal community in January of 2011 with the opening of the new Thomas Mayfield Regional Animal Services Center. By the beginning of 2012, after a full year of operation, we celebrated a successful transition of our programs and services into our new home and honored a dream realized.

Stanislaus Animal Services Agency (The Agency) is a leader in animal welfare. In these times, organizations, including government, secure sustainability by becoming more efficient. All programs are assessed for cost benefit. Assessing every program and investment is a leader's challenge.

In animal welfare, those decisions are not easy. We ask ourselves everyday: "How can we benefit the animals and the community we live in each day?" When lives are at stake it is never an easy endeavor. The Agency is constantly looking at continuous and meaningful change. How can we provide the best level of service, help animals reunite with families, honor our commitment to increase the number of animals that return home each day and decrease euthanasia.

The shelter experienced an overall 4.7% reduction in the intake of animals for FY 2011-2012 compared to FY 2010-2011. The true success was 1218 less kittens were euthanized and total euthanasia was reduced by 11.3% from FY 2010-2011 to FY 2011-2012.

More recently, we have focused on refining and expanding our core operational programs. We know that our work will never be done. While we continue to break new ground in our region, serving thousands of pets and people every year, we will always dedicate ourselves to building proactive solutions, forging new relationships, and evolving to meet the changing needs of our community.

The recognition belongs to the real heroes in this organization. They are all the employees at all levels of the organization, volunteers and partners! It is because we function as a team, that we are able to accomplish what so many consider impossible.




